Following lunch, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Harold Blasch.

WISCONSIN CHAPTER

The 48th Annual Chapter Meeting was held April 25-27 at the Midway Motor Lodge in Wauwatosa, with a registration of 128 men and 72 ladies. The meetings were conducted by Chairman Harold Blaasch. The appointment of committees consisted of Auditing, Ralph Zabel and Ed Lawry; Nominating, Ralph Golomboski, Joe Schoenhaar, and Ray Howard; Resolutions, Gary Hacker and Don Healy.

The secretary's report noted a sizable increase in membership with the reading of the list of 44 new members, some of which were present. Members were urged to attend the Western Section meeting in Detroit at which time our Chapter representative, Ed Lawry, will officiate as President of the Western Section.

Gary Hacker, membership chairman, reported on his activities of promoting membership which has shown positive results.

Norman Davis III, Und. Labs., Chicago, gave two interesting presentations, one of which was a slide presentation on lightning protection and the other was News from Und. Labs.

On Wednesday afternoon, April 25, Mr. M. W. Stehr, Application Research Engineer, Wisconsin Electric Power, Milwaukee, spoke on Short Circuit Current and Interrupting Capacity, showed slides and explained the problems encountered with these potential hazards.

The meeting recessed for the day with an evening welcome hour, courtesy of the Milwaukee Chapter of N.E.C.A.

Thursday morning opened with a welcome from Mayor F. D. Kuckuck, of Wauwatosa.

N. C. Storck, Vice President, Transmission and Distribution, Wisconsin Electric Power Co., Milwaukee, spoke on the subject of "Watts Happening in Eastern Wisconsin." Slides were shown depicting the regulation and control of transmission.

Recent OSHA Electrical Interpretations on various code articles were explained by Ed Lawry, State Electrical Engineer. The plan of intended enforcement of the law by the State was explained.

The Code Panel for questions and answers was moderated by Sam Mazlack. Panel members were Robert Pullen, Bernie Wisniewski, William Raymond and Ed Lawry. The panel deliberated on numerous Code questions with the majority of questions answered satisfactorily. Each chapter member will be mailed a list of the questions and answers.

The banquet for 175 persons was preceded by a poolside hospitality hour. Mrs. Mary McBride, top gag writer for Phyllis Diller, provided the enjoyable entertainment, followed with music and dancing.

The April 27th morning session continued with a report by John Clements, Task Force Committee chairman, on proposed legislation relative to registering electrical contractors, licensing master electricians, and certifying inspectors. During the business session, Bernard Smigelski, Electrical Inspector, Waukesha, was elected to the Executive Committee and Samuel Mazlack was chosen to represent the Chapter on the Western Section Executive Committee.

The meetings adjourned at noon with a record attendance noted

SECRETARY-TREASURERS REPORT 1972

GENTLEMEN:

This is to advise you that the Wisconsin Chapter IAEL has never been in a better financial position. Our former Secretary Roland Felix of Oshkosh turned over the accounting books and records last June 8th, after paying the bills for our Wausau Chapter Meeting. A Meeting was arranged with Ed Lawry, Ralph Zabel, of Sheboygan, Roland Felix and myself at which time the books were audited and the checking account was transferred with a balance of \$2627. The checking account as of January 1, 1972 had a balance of \$3003.00 after receiving the chapter's portion of dues from the international office.

The executive committee and officers met last October to make the initial plans for this meeting. It was decided to send out code interpretations again at each mailing as this information is of much benefit to the membership. Also this tends to encourage prospective members to be a part of this association. The committee also approved the expenditure for the Wisconsin State Code, which will be distributed at these meetings.

At the Western section meeting last September I reported on the activity of the Wisconsin Chapter and also attended a Secretary's luncheon. At this luncheon, the Chapter Secretary's discussed with the International office personnel Administrative

problems and procedures. You probably noted this year the use of the International office's address label service which is available to each Chapter at nominal cost. From discussions with some of the other Chapter Secretary's I drew the conclusions that our chapter should be much more active and that our members could be more organizational minded. That is to say, be more concerned about the benefits derived from being a member and have more general interest in the Chapter's activities.

At the western section meeting, the Minnesota Chapter chartered a bus for members and their wives and the Michigan Chapter had a private suite of rooms with snacks and refreshments for their members. Both of these Chapters more than double the membership we have. Our present membership consists of 105 active and 93 associate members. Presently we have, of this number, 13 members who are delinquent either 30, 60 or 90 days in their dues payment. Also we carry a list of 62 suspended members who have failed to renew their dues.

We should be concerned about our membership as I feel there is a very good potential of prospective members around the State. There are many township inspectors, part-time inspectors, contractors and some municipal inspectors that do not hold membership in our association.

~~chapter meetings, we can also increase our associate membership.~~ We even have State employed circuit instructors who do not receive the "I.A.E.I. News and yet teach code to the apprentices.

This association is in a position, now especially with the new Occupational Safety and health law to really promote electrical safety and code complying installations, so lets get busy and do something about increasing our membership.

The Western section meets again ~~this~~ next September in Indianapolis and the following year in Detroit. At the Detroit meetings our good friend Ed Lawry from our Chapter will be President of the Western Section and will conduct the meetings. This is a great honor and recognition of his work in our State. Our Chapter should consider making a special effort to try and get as many members as possible to attend the meetings in Detroit. We should plan ahead for September 73 for this special event. The following are the new members who have joined our Association since our last meeting in Wausau.

The 47th Annual Chapter Meeting was held at the Midway Motor Lodge, in Madison April 26-28th. There were 112 members and guests registered and 42 ladies participated in the ladies' program.

The Executive Committee and officers met prior to registration. Chairman Joseph Schoenhaar called the annual meeting to order at 1:30 P.M. Following the Committee appointments for Auditing, Nominating and Resolutions, the Secretary's report included a plea for more membership participation in the Chapter Activities. The report also included the introduction of the past year's new members and information on the Western Section meeting.

A discussion period followed highlighting the changes in the '72 N. E. Code and the '72 Wisconsin supplement to the National Electrical Code. Leading the two-and-a-half hour discussion was Richard Lloyd, Chairman, National Electrical Code Correlating Committee, Robert Pullen NEMA and Ed. Lawry, Electrical Engineer, Madison. A welcome hour at poolside climaxed the first day's activities.

Thursday's, April 27th program began with a welcome to Madison from Robert Friess, Building Inspection Superintendent. Orville Cavanagh, followed with a presentation of "News from U. L." It was noted that this meeting would be the last one that Mr. Cavanagh would be attending in his official capacity as his

retirement is near. The Wisconsin Chapter wished him well and thanked him for his many years of advice and council.

The secretary reported on the newly formed State Task Force Committee on Electrical Inspection. Introduced were Bob Johnson and Jim O'Brien, the other two inspector members of the 15 member Ad Hoc Committee. Discussed was the purpose of the Committee, the procedure it will follow and the goal the Committee wishes to accomplish. The method of regulating electrical work in other states will be researched and hopefully the committee work will be completed by December 1972 with recommended legislation.

Mr. Ronald Remy, Madison, of the Department of Industry and Labor reported on the new OSHA regulations and how it affects electrical inspection. Discussed was the retroactive portion of the law with respect to existing installations.

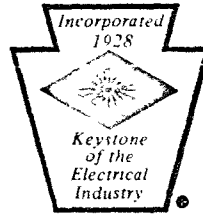

The banquet was attended by 122 persons with Reginald Kilps, Inspector, Madison, in charge of local arrangements.
