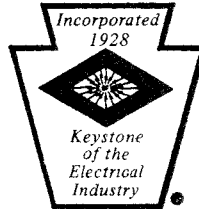

## SECRETARY-TREASURER'S REPORT 1973

To our guests and new members present, welcome to our friendly group. This association represents some of the best talents in the State when it comes to electrical construction knowhow and we hope that you, who will attend these sessions for the first time, will benefit by our program that follows.

Last year I reported a chapter membership of 198 and this year the number is 221 for a net gain of 23. The new members who have joined our association since our last meeting are as follows:

Last September, I represented our Chapter at the Western Section meeting in Indianapolis and reported on our Chapter activity. This year, the Western section meets in Detroit on September 24-26, at the Sheraton-Cadillac Hotel. I am sure that most of you are aware that Ed Lawry this year is president of the 18-state Western Section area and he will officiate at these meetings. The last time that a Wisconsin member was President of the Western section was in 1935 when John Wise was so honored. Somehow, someday, or by some fashion our chapter should make a special effort to be represented in Detroit with a good group of members. Possibly some money could be spent for this purpose and hopefully some suggestions can be made at our business session on Friday morning. Also, our Chapter has been asked to submit or appoint a member from our chapter to the Western Section Executive Committee. This appointment should be made by the nominating committee.

Last November, the Officers and Executive Committee met and initiated plans for this meeting, discussed our Chapter activities and the books were audited. Our treasury shows a balance April 1st of \$2892.00--about \$74.00 more than last year at this time. For most of the year our money is invested in a savings account, realizing some interest.

There has been some sentiment expressed favoring a 2-day annual meeting rather than a 3-day like we have now, and then holding an additional one-day Code Seminar in another area of the State. In that way we could benefit more of the members who can't make the 3-day annual meeting. This idea was suggested and could be given consideration if you so wish.

This last year our association was represented by 3 members on a Task Force Committee which studied the electrical laws of other States and has recommended legislation. When one compares the laws of our neighboring states with what we have in Wisconsin, one can conclude that Wisconsin has fallen way behind in the regulation of new electrical work. All of the different segments of the electrical industry, especially the utilities who sell the product, should realize this and work together to improve our standards. A report of this committee will be given on our program Friday morning.
